We are a small house church living and serving in the same neighborhood for about 40 years. Our strong emphasis is on living out the "one-to-another" scriptures through commitment and accountability. One of our ambitions is to see the Church beyond the boundaries of our local congregation.

We've all been figuring out how to survive through the pandemic over the last couple of years, and everyone has handled it differently, but all have been affected. We decided it was crucial to protect vulnerable folks that we loved in the best way we knew how, taking precautions for people inside and outside the congregation. Just as importantly, we believe that the Kingdom of God does not stop moving for the factors of the world. We established a Zoom bible study, sent sheafs of drawings and notes from our kids to a local nursing home, did our annual Christmas carolling adventure, and did as much meeting outside as we possibly could to keep the element of face-to-face relationships. Thank God for balmy California weather! One of the most rewarding changes from pandemic life was our outdoor Sunday morning gathering. We set up some patio furniture under a cover in our front yard, brewed some coffee and put out some donuts, and committed to be visible and present in our neighborhood for a few hours every Sunday morning. The canopy, friendly faces and comfortable space drew in a Peruvian family who still connect with us across the miles, a new babysitter, and a few folks we've lived around the corner from for a decade but never met. We're thankful for the friendships that have blossomed from that endeavour and the life it's brought to our area and ourselves. Please pray that these new relationships turn into opportunities for discipleship.





Maddy's Neurologist explained that Maddy's risk of tumor, stroke, head injury etc. is the same as anybody else, and she can resume regular activities without the stinky helmet. Now its our job as parents not to be afraid every moment because she is quite unsteady and falls often. However, we are grateful the scans are clear. She will always have a void in her head where the tumor was, just fluid there now. They will continue to do 'regular surveillance' on her noggin yearly just to be sure, but it appears she is free and clear."

They have honored the Lord greatly through this trial by living by the song: "It Is Well With My Soul."
